Project results area A: Food Security and Livelihoods

i) Increased access to nutritious food for consumption and income generation among 2400 (14,400 Individuals) households in Barmayen County and Jur River County.

The project increased access to crop seeds for farmers, increased land acreage under cultivation, increased household income through sale of surplus food produced and cash management from crop sales, improved farming practices through practicing conservation agriculture, reducing food losses through post-harvest losses management, improved household nutrition, increased vegetable and medicinal plants production, improving fish and vegetable preservation methods, increasing asset ownership at household level, improved small livestock production and management, improving local tool production for agriculture, increased community resilience through implementing CMDRR Plans and practices

Project result Area 2: Water and Sanitation (WASH)

i) Increased access of 2400 (14,400 Individuals) households to clean, safe and adequate water, hygiene and sanitation.

The project will achieved the following during the project period

Reduced the walking distance to the water point to a maximum of 500metres, reduced incidence of water borne illnesses and communicable diseases, reduced conflict resulting from competition over water points, improved water governance, increased number of house /holds with pit latrines to reach a toilet coverage of 40% within the community.

Project Result Area 3: Strengthened Peace Relationships and Social cohesion

i) Strengthened social cohesion and protection amongst 2400 HH (14,400 individuals)

Outcomes: reduction in incidences of community conflict, enhancing local solutions to local conflicts, peaceful co-existence between farmers and pastoralists, improved adult literacy, abolition of harmful cultural practices, reduction in cases of Sexual and gender Based violence (SGBV)

Theme: Peace Building, Human Rights and Good Governance

Project Name: Health Legacy – Gender Based Violence and Community Resilience

Donor: Christian Aid (South Sudan programme)

Years Implemented: 1st August 2017 - 31st July 2020

Outcomes

- ❖ Women have better access and control over resources, they have access to capital for engaging into farming, and small business. They are able to contribute to household needs, pay hospital bills and pay school fees for their children.
- ❖ Reduced instances of Community violence - competition for water, pasture, domestic violence, and land disputes have significantly reduced. Before the intervention there were lot of intra-communal violence, which led to further revenge attacks and killings, displacing people but this has significantly reduced. Cases with gender dimensions like girl's elopement, unpaid dowry, and adultery and wife inheritance have also reduced
- ❖ Increased recognition of women' voices in community leadership and other community life.
- ❖ Visible change of attitudes and behavior in relation to gender stereotypes within the community
- ❖ Increased reporting of GBV cases by GBV survivors. Survivors are able to report cases through an established referral pathway consisting of legal, medical, and Psychosocial support practitioners based at the community
- ❖ Over 400 women and girls have access to Safe space in Barmayen. The project constructed a women center and women and girls have a place where they can meet and plan issues affecting them.
